B. The type of combination

2. The Proposed Transaction involves a merger of CNIL into GIL pursuant to a scheme of amalgamation under Section 230 to 232 of the Companies Act, 2013. The Proposed Transaction falls within the definition of a "combination" pursuant to Section 5(c) of the Competition Act.

C. The area of activity of the parties to the combination GIL

 GTL Infrastructure Limited is a company incorporated under the provisions of the Companies Act 1956 and has its registered office at Mumbai. GIL provides passive infrastructure services for telecom companies by constructing, owning, operating and maintaining towers for telecom operators.

CNIL

4. Chennai Network Infrastructure Limited is a company incorporated under the provisions of the Companies Act 1956 and has its registered office at Chennai. CNIL provides passive infrastructure services for telecom companies by constructing, owning, operating and maintaining towers for telecom operators

D. The relevant markets to which the combination relates

- The relevant product market for the purposes of the Proposed
 Transaction is the market for provision of passive infrastructure services (to various telecom operators).
- 6. The relevant geographic market for the purposes of the Proposed Transaction should be considered on a national basis, i.e., pan India, because the conditions for supply of these services are uniform across India. The same players are active in most parts of India, and service the same set of customers in most parts of the country.
- 7. However, with a view to assist the Hon'ble Commission, the Parties have also provided information on a circle-wise basis, for

the circles in which the Parties activities overlap in India namely, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Mumbai, Maharashtra, Delhi NCR, Himachal Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh East, Uttar Pradesh West, Jammu & Kashmir, Orissa, Bihar, Kolkata, West Bengal, Assam and North East.
